HONOURING A VISIONARY

Leon Gordenker

Professor Emeritus of Politics at Princeton University,
and founding member of ACUNS



Leon Gordenker, now Professor Emeritus of Politics at Princeton University, helped plan ACUNS and get the fledgling organization started in 1986. It linked to his deep interest in global international cooperation, partly based on his own experience even before the San Francisco Conference with what became the UN System. He was a member of the UN Secretariat from 1946 to 1952 after which he pursued an academic career.

By the time ACUNS was established with crucial initiative from the late Prof. Gene Lyons and his Dartmouth College, many scholars were viewing with dismay a decline in teaching and research on the burgeoning UN system and what now is seen as global governance. The founders of ACUNS perceived that a new generation of teachers and scholars was needed to build on existing knowledge, explain developments and promote objective teaching on a broadening agenda. That new generation now leads ACUNS and carries out a broadened program with a membership drawn from institutions much beyond the original North American cohort. To the early summer workshop, still meeting annually, ACUNS added the successful journal *Global Governance*. It was based on a memorandum Gordenker submitted to the leadership. Gordenker also compiled the retrospective report on the first decade of ACUNS operation.

Gordenker's research over the years has included books on the UN Secretary-General and secretariat, international development programs, international responses to refugees, creation of international cooperation on AIDS and many academic articles related to the UN system.

In 1994 when ACUNS last gathered in the Netherlands, Gordenker had much pleasure in hosting a post-conference luncheon for members at the house in the province of Zeeland that his family used in summer vacations. He now lives in Zeeland and still uses the house.
